



Photography Apprentice

The Photography Apprentice will explore how visual storytelling captures the artistry, emotion, and collaboration of live theatre. Under the mentorship of a qualified photographer, staff member, or experienced alum, this apprentice will gain hands-on experience in theatrical photography, digital organization, and visual documentation for the production.

Throughout the program, the apprentice will:

- Learn the fundamentals of photography, including composition, lighting, focus, and timing for live performance and rehearsal settings.
- Capture production photos, rehearsal shots, and promotional images for use in marketing, publicity, and archival materials.
- Assist in editing, organizing, and cataloging photos for digital and printed use.
- Practice photographing in varied lighting conditions, learning how to adapt to changing stage environments.
- Collaborate with the Marketing and Publicity Apprentices to provide high-quality images for posters, programs, social media, and press materials.

This apprenticeship emphasizes creativity, attention to detail, and professionalism. Apprentices must be willing to take direction, respect rehearsal and performance etiquette, and dedicate time outside of rehearsal and school hours to capture and edit photos. A spirit of humility, patience, and curiosity is essential — great theatre photography requires observation, sensitivity, and respect for the craft of performance.

This is not a leadership position, but a learning opportunity for students eager to develop technical photography skills, artistic perspective, and the ability to document and celebrate the collaborative work of the theatre department.
