



Choreography Apprentice

The Choreography Apprentice will explore how movement, rhythm, and staging bring stories to life on stage. Under the mentorship of a qualified choreographer, staff member, or experienced alum, this apprentice will gain hands-on experience in the creative and practical processes of theatrical choreography, supporting the development and execution of dance and movement sequences in the production.

Throughout the program, the apprentice will:

- Learn the fundamentals of choreography, including movement vocabulary, rhythm, spacing, and storytelling through physical expression.
- Assist in teaching and rehearsing choreography with performers under the direction of the choreographer or director.
- Help with recording, documenting, and organizing choreography notes and videos for cast reference.
- Observe and participate in blocking and movement rehearsals, learning how choreography integrates with music, staging, and design.
- Support warm-ups and movement reviews during the rehearsal process.
- Gain an understanding of how choreography contributes to character development and ensemble storytelling in different performance styles.

This apprenticeship emphasizes collaboration, discipline, and humility. Apprentices must be willing to take direction, work closely with the choreographer and cast, and dedicate time beyond rehearsal and school hours to support the creative process. A spirit of curiosity, respect, and adaptability is essential — choreography is both an art and a discipline that thrives on teamwork and open-minded learning.

This is not a leadership position, but a learning opportunity for students eager to develop their understanding of movement, stage dynamics, and the collaborative process that makes dance an integral part of theatrical storytelling.
